

## Study Leave and Exams Student Information



### AS/A2 Subjects

- You are to continue with AS/A2 subject lessons up until and including 21<sup>st</sup> May.
- You must continue to attend all of your subject lessons until you have sat your examination for that subject, after which you no longer have to attend the subject lesson.
- You will not be required to attend registration, Wed briefing and tutorial or enrichment from Mon 24<sup>th</sup> May. However, you will be expected to sign in and out at reception when you arrive and leave the building.
- From Monday 21<sup>st</sup> June all Yr 12 lessons revert to A2 content and anyone wishing to take the subject must then attend these lessons. Similarly registration, Wed briefing, tutorial and enrichment will recommence this week.
- Lessons between 24<sup>th</sup> May and 21<sup>st</sup> June will solely concentrate on preparation towards AS exams, no A2 content will be taught.

### BTEC/Cache/OCR Subjects

- Prior to 24<sup>th</sup> May if you are on a BTEC/Cache/OCR course where all your exams have been taken and coursework completed / signed off, then you will start your second year work. You must continue to attend the BTEC/Cache/OCR course throughout the exam period.

If your exams finish early, you do not need to attend the Sixth Form until 21<sup>st</sup> June, but you may still sign in and use the facilities for study and revision preparation.

### Dropping a Subject

- Anyone not returning to their subject after 21<sup>st</sup> June must complete the Subject Transfer/Dropping form from reception and have it signed by their subject teacher, tutor and Head of Sixth Form. They can then use this time for independent study in the Sixth Form building.

You need to be aware that if you do not attend your A2 lessons from 21<sup>st</sup> June it will **not** be possible for you to enroll on the course in September 2010 (as you will have missed 25 hours of lessons plus any Summer work). If there is a **slight possibility** that you may wish to continue with the subject, you should attend the A2 lessons prior to the Summer. It is far better that you attend and be given the opportunity to drop in September than it is for you to try and catch up on work if, following the results you decide that you would like to continue.
