

Literacy and numeracy catch up premium (CUP)

1. Funding Allocation for the Current Academic Year

The Department for Education has allocated £500 per student for the number of year 7 students who are not secondary ready in reading and/or mathematics at Key Stage 2. This grant is awarded to the academy in February of the year the students are in year 7 and is used to support students in this category to 'catch up'. Our funding allocation for this cohort was £6000.

2. How the impact of Year 7 literacy and numeracy catch up premium is measured

At Nunthorpe we accurately measure progress through three academy data collection points. This data is analysed to measure the impact of the additional strategies and interventions. In addition, we track attendance, punctuality and behaviour for learning data which also indicates students' attitudes to learning and progress in both pastoral and academic areas.

4. Impact of allocation of the literacy and numeracy catch up premium Feb 20-Feb 21

Our data capture for current CUP students demonstrate that;
