

Sides

- Produce a tonal scale using an unusual material.
- Produce a leaflet or poster advertising an Art Exhibition of Roy Lichtenstein's work.
- Create a drawing of a highly patterned sock, scarf or glove.
- Research the Artist lamboey, produce your own drawing on a disposable cup, photograph it and stick in your homework book.
- Produce a line drawing of a chocolate bar in the style of the Artist Patrick Caulfield.

Drinks

- Design a meal in the style of one the artists you have looked at.
- Take 3 photographs of still life arrangements, print and stick them in your homework book.
- Draw a cup and saucer. Use pencil tones to show shadows and light parts.
- Create a close-up drawing of a cross-section of fruit or a vegetable.
- Produce a silhouette drawing of bottles, jars, glasses etc.

Choose your homework from the menu:

Every term you should attempt at least one 'EXTRA HOT' task!

All work must be completed in your homework book.

Keep a record of your points in the front of your homework book.

Starters

- Visit an Art Gallery or Museum. Collect leaflets/flyers from your visit.
- Look at a painting by Roy Lichtenstein and describe what you find interesting about his style of paintings.
- Find images of Andy Warhol's prints. Write a few sentences about what you think makes them stand out.
- Create a collage of a 'Still Life' using images out of magazines & newspapers. Create a drawing of your collage animal.
- Look at your tea tonight, have a go at drawing it. Include intricate details, shade.

Main Course

- Draw a study of biscuits and sweets using mixed media.
- TRY EXTRA HOT FOR 1 EXTRA POINT - Add your own creative touch by adding colour.
- Draw a biscuit. Think about the formal elements: colour, tone, shape, pattern, line and texture.
- TRY EXTRA HOT FOR 1 EXTRA POINT - Take a bite from the biscuit before you draw it.
- Create a surreal drawing of a clock inspired by the films of Tim Burton.
- TRY EXTRA HOT FOR 1 EXTRA POINT - Give it moving parts.
- Research Giuseppe Arcimboldo and Carl Warner. Draw a landscape or face that looks like it was made from sweets.
- TRY EXTRA HOT FOR 2 EXTRA POINTS - Make a model from food, photograph it, print photographs and stick in your homework book.
- TRY EXTRA HOT FOR 5 EXTRA POINTS - 'Art in a Box' create a 3D room in a box. No bigger than a shoe box/ matchbox/ cereal box. It can be a real room or an imaginary room. Have fun and be creative.

Desserts

- Look at Richard Hamilton's artwork 'Just What is it that Makes Today's Homes so Different, so Appealing'. Write a short story about what is happening in the image.
- Create a photomontage of your bedroom using magazines, food packets, photographs etc.
- Create a still-life in the style of Pop Art.
- Find 3 photographs that show: 1 point perspective. Draw the vanishing point on each image.
- Draw a picture of a room that an artist of your choice could have lived in. It could be any room: living room/studio/bedroom/kitchen etc.
