## Starters

- Look at the website Pinterest to search for Optical Illusions. Find and print 4 images that you find interesting. Stick them into your homework book and annotate them.
- Create a poster or leaflet to advertise an exhibition of a painting by Bridget Riley.

## Main Course

- Draw a portrait of a celebrity. Use pencil to sketch the outline. Be accurate and add tone.
- TRY EXTRA HOT FOR 1 EXTRA POINT - Add your own creative touch by adding colour.
- Create your own optical illusion. Use pencil to sketch the outline. Be accurate and add a colour.
- TRY EXTRA HOT FOR 1 EXTRA POINT - Add your own creative touch by adding 2 colours.
- Aboriginal Art is often painted on stones or wood. Create your own Aboriginal Artwork on an unusual object.
- TRY EXTRA HOT FOR 1 EXTRA POINT - Create the dots in the same way Aboriginal Artists do.
- Research Giuseppe Arcimboldo and Carl Warner. Draw a landscape or face that looks like it was made from food.
- TRY EXTRA HOT FOR 2 EXTRA POINTS - Make a model from food, photograph it and stick in your homework book.
- Draw the same piece of fruit everyday for a week.
- TRY EXTRA HOT FOR 5 EXTRA POINTS - Take photographs of the fruit decomposing each day. Print and stick (in order of decomposition) In your homework book.
