

Nunthorpe Academy Relationships and Sexual Education Curriculum 2023/24

INTENT:

To embrace the challenges of creating a happy and successful adult life, students need knowledge that will enable them to make informed decisions about their wellbeing, health and relationships and to build their self-efficacy. Students can also put this knowledge into practice as they develop the capacity to make sound decisions when facing risks, challenges and complex contexts. Everyone faces difficult situations in their lives. These subjects can support young people to develop resilience, to know how and when to ask for help, and to know where to access support. Children are naturally curious about growing up, how their bodies work and how humans reproduce. Their questions need to be answered honestly, using correct language and explanations appropriate for their age and maturity, thus avoiding unnecessary mystery, confusion, embarrassment and shame. Relationships and Sex Education addresses the questions and concerns raised by the biological facts – for example, exploring the feelings a new baby can bring, or the effect of puberty on friendships. It provides balance to sometimes distorted messages about sex and gender roles in the media, and helps protect children by explaining boundaries and safety, and developing the language and understanding needed to recognise abusive behaviour and seek help. It also helps students to develop respectful and consensual attitudes and behaviours. Relationships and Sex Education provides an understanding that positive, caring environments are essential for the development of a good self-image and that individuals are in charge of and responsible for their own bodies. It ought to provide knowledge about the processes of reproduction and the nature of sexuality and relationships. It should encourage the acquisition of skills and attitudes which allow students to manage their relationships in a responsible and healthy manner. We are aware that for many young people the distinction between the online world and other aspects of life is less marked than for some adults. Young people often operate very freely in the online world and by secondary school age some are likely to be spending a substantial amount of time online.

IMPLEMENTATION

In this curriculum plan we will set out to ensure we cover the following:

- Relationships and Sex Education. (Respectful relationships, intimate sexual and online relationships)
- The Law. (marriage • consent, including the age of consent • violence against women and girls • online behaviours including image and information sharing (including 'sexting', youth-produced sexual imagery, nudes, etc.) • pornography • abortion • sexuality • gender identity • substance misuse • violence and exploitation by gangs • extremism/radicalisation • criminal exploitation (for example, through gang involvement or 'county lines' drugs operations) • hate crime • female genital mutilation (FGM)
- Physical Health and Mental Wellbeing. Mental wellbeing, internet safety, Physical health and fitness, Healthy Living, drugs, alcohol, tobacco, first aid
- Menstruation.



Where possible, all subject specific lessons and pastoral sessions will provide students with the opportunity to openly discuss and experience these aspects in detail on either a local, national or global context. This is only emphasised through our broad and diverse school community of whom understand and respects that such potential contrast in views, make for a more diverse range of opinion. We ensure that through examining these skills through aspects of everyday academy life, both pupils and staff are mindful and respectful when exploring or discussing these topics.
