Students in LIFE lessons have been covering an array of important topics designed to equip them with the knowledge and skills necessary to ensure their safety in various situations.

Lastly, our Key Stage 4 students have been enhancing their financial literacy—a critical skill identified as a gap by employers in the North East. This education aims to empower them to manage their finances effectively, recognize and avoid scams and fraud, and prevent debt accumulation.
